

## .NET Developer

On average the permanent salaries for .NET jobs has increased by 6.25% to £42,500 in comparison to the same period last year. In terms of demand, the numbers of .NET roles available has increased dramatically on 2009 and whilst not at 2008 levels the trends remain positive.

When looking at the related skills we see Silverlight, for the first time as one of the “top 30”. Interestingly when you look at the demand for “Silverlight Developers” there has been a huge increase (41.17%) in permanent salaries and whilst numbers of matching permanent job adverts remain relatively low this is clearly a skill that is ever more in demand.
